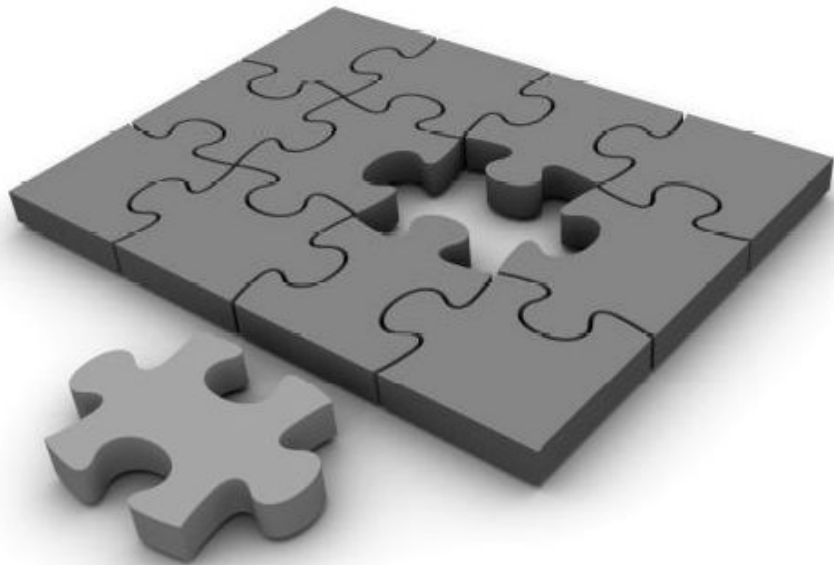


Studies in Daniel – (Study 26)

Reading: Daniel 6:10-15



Living a godly life in an ungodly world

Home Fellowship Group Bible Study notes
Tuesday 14th / Wednesday 15th April

- 1) Daniel's response when he learnt of this decree is interesting; bearing in mind that he would have known what was behind it. *What other options might he have considered at this point?*
- 2) It could be concluded that there is a time to just close the windows, shut the curtains and play it low key. Verse 10 tells us that for Daniel this was not one of those times. *What are the arguments for and against the wisdom of this open defiance?*
- 3) Verses 10-11 reveal several things concerning prayer. *What is the significance of the windows opening towards Jerusalem and what does it teach us?*
- 4) The second half of verse 10 might suggest that Daniel's prayer life was somewhat legalistic. *What helpful pointers can we glean from his example in prayer?*
- 5) This is not the first time in our studies that we have read of Daniel praying for help. *What was the other occasion and how do you think the experience then helped Daniel now?*
- 6) One commentator on verses 12-15 suggests that 'with a few clear strokes the author has again sketched both the terror and the limitations of human power'. *What do you think he means?*
