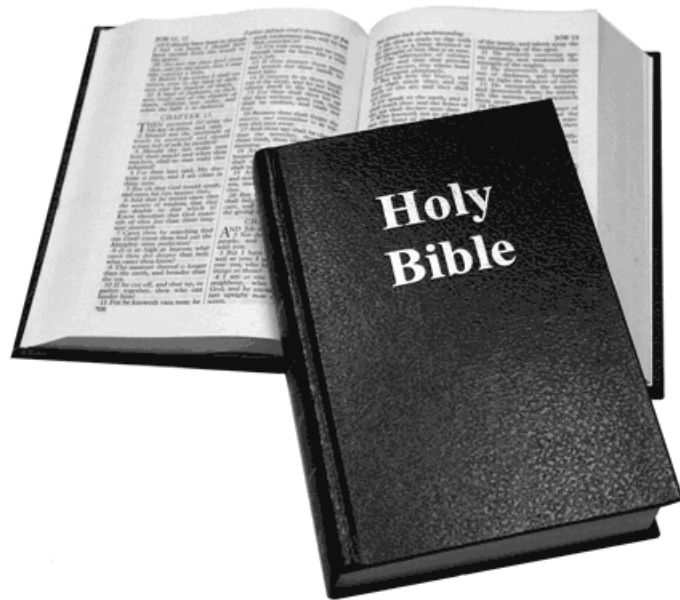


Studies in John – (Study 7)
“And he brought him to Jesus”

Reading: John 1:35-42



*“These things are written so
that you may believe that
Jesus is the Christ...”*

The rest of chapter 1 describes the calling of the first of Jesus' disciples and shares something of the testimony of how ordinary lives are transformed when they have met with Jesus.

- 1) Verse 36 is a repeat of what we found John declaring in verse 29. *Why is this so important and what lessons does it teach us in our work for God today?*
- 2) At first glance the question Jesus asks these men in verse 38 seems more of a rebuke. *Why does Jesus ask them what they want?*
- 3) John's disciples had clearly not responded the first time they heard the declaration about the Lamb. *What is different about the response the next day?*
- 4) In verses 41-42, what can we learn about Andrew from how he followed up this meeting with Jesus?
- 5) John sums up the call of Simon Peter in one brief statement; in fact using less 'column inches' than he does about Andrew. *What do we learn from Jesus' response to Peter?*
- 6) Andrew's life was lived in the shadow of his more famous brother and yet what a part Andrew had to play in Peter's life and subsequent ministry. *How should that encourage our witness and service today?*
