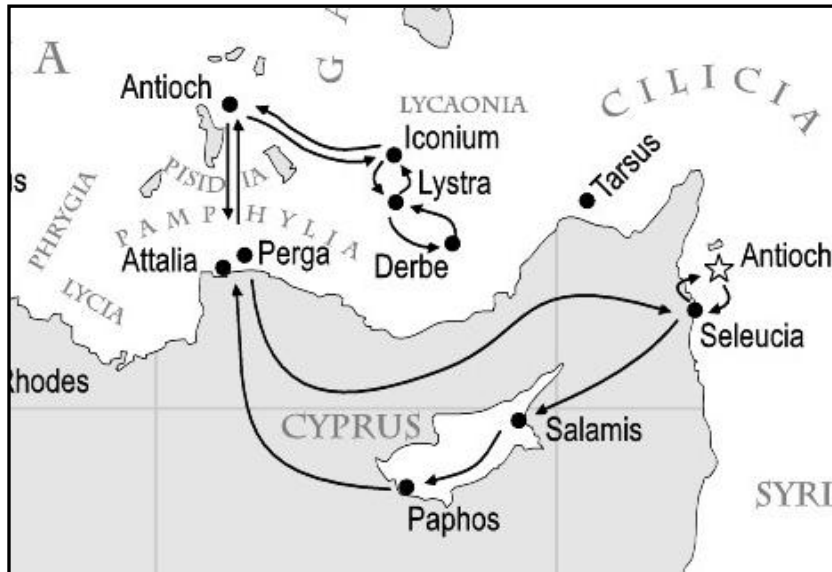


## Paul's First Missionary Journey – (Study 12) “Speaking boldly for the Lord”

Reading: Acts 14:1-7



*“And you will be my witnesses...to the ends of the earth”*

Paul and Barnabas now head 80-100 miles southeast to the city of Iconium.

- 1) What recurring themes on this journey do we find in verse 1?
  - 2) What do you think Luke means in verse 2 when he says that the unbelieving Jews stirred up the Gentiles?
  - 3) In verse 3; what is the relationship between what Paul and Barnabas said, and what God did?
  - 4) What does verse 4 tell us about the response to the preaching of the gospel, and how should that affect our attitude to this work?
- Those opposing Paul and Barnabas are successful in stirring up both Jew and Gentile.**
- 5) Looking at verses 5-6; at what point is it right for Christians to remove themselves from places of opposition rather than suffer for the gospel?
  - 6) Verse 7 shows that Paul and Barnabas were clearly focussed on their calling; regardless of the consequences. *How can we make the proclamation of the gospel a priority in our life and our church?*
